

How many job postings were active for at least 1 day this month?




NUMBER OF ACTIVE JOB BOARDS

How many job postings were active for at least 1 day this month on these job boards?




AVG & MEDIAN POSTING LENGTH BY DAYS

How many job postings were active for at least 1 day this month?



How many job postings were active for at least 1 day this month by sector?










JOB DURATION Permanency of jobs posted




JOB POSTINGS BY JOB CATEGORY












